Farewell Spit

On your tour journey you'll travel to Cape Farewell, the South Island's most northern point), be awed by dramatic coastal cliffs, fur seals, fossilised shells, sand dunes, the iconic lighthouse and more. Guides are passionate about the history, ecology and wildlife of the Spit and want you to be inspired and feel connected to nature on your tour.



During the summer there are up to 15,000 godwits and 15,000 knots at the Spit as well as other northern migratory birds, New Zealand natives and introduced species. It's a nature-lovers paradise.

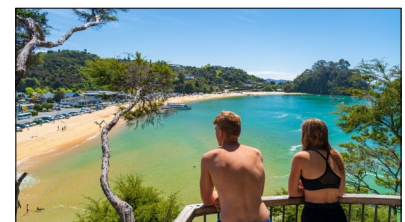
Travel along the 35km long spit and climb a sand dune for panoramic views of the ocean beach. With the changing colours of the sand dunes its beautiful at any time of the day.

You'll spend time at the Farewell Spit Lighthouse and enjoy refreshments in the lighthouse keepers' residence.

Abel Tasman Helicopter Experience

Take a flight over the golden-sand beaches and pristine waters of the Abel Tasman National Park, New Zealand's smallest National Park. Land for an optional lunch at Awaroa Lodge then take a stroll down the beach or swim in the clear waters of Awaroa Bay, before returning to our Nelson Airport Base via the Tasman Bay coastline.

Awaroa Lodge is usually open from 1st September to late May or there may be the option to take a grazing box on tour.

Fly over the bush on the Skywire

Experience one of the World's longest Flying Fox's! This one-of-a-kind experience is an amazing scenic ride with a shot of adrenaline flying high above the forest canopy.

We'll shuttle you through old native forest, to the Skywire platform at 300m, then harness you in, 4 at a time, to the Skywire and away you go! Travel 3.2kms, at up to 100kmph, across the valley with your feet dangling above the tree canopy. Take in the views across the Tasman Sea while you fly through the sky.

Free transfers with a minimum of 4 pax.

Brook Waimārama Sanctuary

Immerse yourself in the natural beauty of the Brook Waimārama Sanctuary. Located only 10 minutes from Nelson's CBD, the Sanctuary is the largest predator-free fenced eco-haven in the South Island.

This 690-hectare hidden jewel provides a pristine environment where native flora and fauna can thrive. The Sanctuary is unique in its abundant mature Beech Forest, making it the perfect habitat to support a large population of Kākāriki Karaka. These orange-fronted parakeets are one of the rarest birds in the world, and until recently have only been found on off-shore islands.

Come and discover this ambitious community-led restoration project and enjoy the extensive network of well-maintained walking tracks ranging from 45 minutes to 6 hours in duration.

SUP in the Beautiful Tasman Bay

Join the best paddling adventures from Tahunanui Beach, only minutes from the heart of Nelson City. Stand-up paddleboards (SUP's) and sit-on-top kayaks are available to hire by the hour, or longer, to explore the Nelson Haven at your leisure, or join us on one of our amazing guided paddleboard tours to Haulashore Island. These two-hour trips take in all the sights and sounds of our harbour as we paddle past the iconic Fifeshire Rock to Haulashore Island. There's time to explore the island before a short paddle back to the beach.

For the more adventurous paddlers we offer a guided NIGHT paddle. This is a truly magical experience using state-of-the-art LED lighting strips to view our playground after dark. A truly unique experience.

Hidden Falls Canyoning

This half day tour, is a perfect combination of thrilling adventure while exploring the stunning native bush of the Nelson Lakes National Park.

After crossing the pristine Lake Rotoiti, under the impressive gaze of Mount Pourangahau / Mt Robert, by water taxi, head off the main track for a 20-minute walk through lush, untouched native bush to the top of the canyon, and then onto jumping, abseiling, sliding and ziplining through this steeply slotted Greywacke Canyon carved by water so pure you can drink.

This is the **perfect half-day experience** for not only those adventurous types who are **keen to discover what canyoning is** all about, but also those who are already familiar with the activity and ready to tick off a new and exciting canyon in Aotearoa, New Zealand.

The Mārahau Pledge

The Mārahau Pledge is a practical commitment by businesses working in the visitor sector to protect and enhance the environment that they love and work in.

All tourism operators in the seaside town of Mārahau, Nelson, have united under a new initiative launched in October 2022, called the [Mārahau Pledge](#). Every single Mārahau-based tourism operator, from canyoning guides to water taxis, has signed up for the pledge.

All signatories must be independently certified as zero-carbon businesses by Ekos, agree to share knowledge with fellow businesses to advance sustainability and give a portion of ticket profits to biodiversity projects in the area.



The new pledge means any local tourism operator you choose in the town will be zero-carbon and donate a portion of your ticket towards a local conservation project.

Kayaking in the Abel Tasman National Park *

Tours include kayaking, cruising, walking or a combination of any of the three with part and full day options.

An example of one tour:

Take a guided scenic water taxi cruise up into the Abel Tasman and see Anchorage, Bark Bay and Tonga Island and the surrounds. Travel back down the coast for lunch before taking a guided kayak adventure from Observation to Marahau. You will experience up close the magic of the Astrolabe Islands and be able to see the conservation work that has been ongoing in the park.

A Short Stroll in the Park

The best short walk in the Abel Tasman.

Catch a water taxi from Marahau to Anchorage, after a quick visit to Split Apple rock, and then a cruise along the coastline past some fantastic beaches. From Anchorage Beach, walk the Pitt Head Loop (about 1.5 hours) via the quintessential, golden-sand, crescent-shaped Te Pukatea Bay. Meet your return water taxi back at Anchorage.



Kayak the sheltered waters of the Astrolabe

If you only have a morning or an afternoon to spare, you can still do a half-day guided kayaking trip. Paddle the stretch of water in the southern part of the Park with your guide and then catch a water taxi back to Marahau. Alternatively, start your trip with a water taxi trip to Observation Beach and then kayak with the afternoon sea breeze back to Marahau.

In either direction, you explore caves, islands and the beautiful beaches along the coast with a local expert at your side.

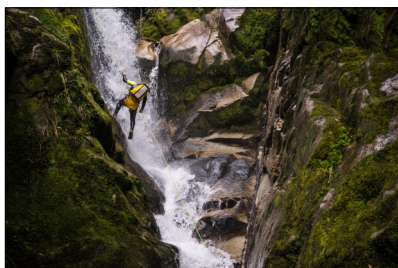
